After the great fire, which destroyed our cottage, the then Parish Vicar the Rev. Owen, collected money to rebuild ours, along with three other cottages in 1865.

It became a Post Office after the turn of the last century. Prior to ourselves moving in, a Mr. Reg Budd had lived here for 35 years, he was a real character and we were lucky enough to meet him. He used to keep a pig and sty in the garden, which Michael Jerrard's grandfather would slaughter for him. Reg was also a bird lover and would hold a robin in his hand while it took some cheese from his mouth.

came to live here 48 years ago to be near my sister and her family.

The house is about 130 years old. It was the blacksmith's house, with the blacksmith's work place the other side of the garage of the house and was for many years known as Forge Cottage. I changed the name to "Woodview" when I altered it 48 years ago, when I had a kitchen and bathroom put in.

Originally the main living room had a red brick floor with kitchen range and old washing copper in the front corner, where the small window on the side of the house was opened to let the steam out on washday
