The problems the village faces are the same as the majority of villages and rural communities have. Properties are sold for high prices to incomers and town people who want to change the way of country life to suit them. Also that any farmland is their playground for them, their children and dogs, regardless whether there are any rights of ways, or crops, or livestock.

y family go back many generations in Damerham. My father and grandfather and great grandfather owned the village bakery and grocer shop. Providing Damerham and outlying villages with bread and provisions. My great grandfather, Charlie Jerrard, lived at Cressview now Common Farm House, he had thirteen children. Great Uncle Aquila had the mill and would mill the grain brought to him by local farmers.

The four wooden houses at West Park Drive were erected after the war for game keepers working on the estate, they are now owned by the owners of Court Farm. These houses have wonderful rural views of the village - totally private apart from Cows, deer game birds - BLISS!

As a child growing up in Damerham it was a small village community where everyone knew one another - today because of its idyllic setting many newcomers have settled here.

More new houses have been built or converted. Tractors have taken over from the usual sight of horse & cart - village life still moves slowly and there is a good sense of village community.



The four bungalows here were originally built for the I.C.I. The people living here then reared a lot of pheasants, hence the very large gardens. The Drive at the front of the bungalow is lined each side by large lime trees. These were planted by Sir Eyre Coote who owned West Park Estate. My first recollection of the four bungalows here was being invited to my friend's birthday party when I was 6/7 years old. My friend lived in the fourth bungalow, and her surname was Sommerville.

I also attended a lunch at Court Farm in 1960 and was filmed by Southern Television for the Farm in the South programme.



ndre is a Builder and his hobbies are game & clay shooting and fishing.

Carolyn is a carer and her hobbies gardening and reading. Our son David is a carpenter and his hobbies are going to the gym. We have three Springer spaniels - all trained gun dogs.

Carolyn previously lived in the village - elder daughter of Gerald & Dorothy Jerrard of Crossways Farm - left the village in 1969. summers then - I remember cycling back to
work one hot summers day in my jeans and a
lime green bikini top on and was stopped by
our local policeman and told off for not
wearing enough clothes!!

We were lucky to have the opportunity to come back to the countryside to live. We intend to spend our time making The Retreat habitable and comfortable for our old age! We would like to grow our own fruit and veg.

The house was used by people who worked for ICI and was put up about 1948. I know that my late Uncle Arch and Aunt Edith Jerrard used to live in the house and that Uncle Arch spent a lot of time working in the garden.

Refurbishing the house will take quite a while and the garden has endless scope and my ambition is to make it as good as my parents' garden at Crossways Farm and have it open to the public as well!
