From Hampshire Trading Standards - "Scams"

What are "Scams"?

- Scams are misleading or fraudulent offers designed to con you out of your money.
- Scams are received by post, by e-mail, by text, by telephone or face-to-face.

The Office of Fair Trading research shows that scammers have targeted half the UK population!

Scammers con 3 million people every year!

Scammers cost the public £3.5 BILLION annually!

Some people have lost their entire life savings!

<u>NEVER</u> reply to anything that may be a scam, because if you do your details will be sold on to others and you will be bombarded by offers.

These people will take your money and even your well-being.

For example: Albert, an 82 year old from Dorset answered a letter telling him that he had won in a Prize Draw.

Albert now receives 70 scam letters every day!

It has been found that he has sent off cheques totalling more than £7,000 hoping to collect his so-called "winnings". He has suffered stress and anxiety and has ended up in residential care.


Scams seem to be believable because they:

- Look professional
- Appear official
- Seem to be personal to you
- Pretend that you are the only winner
- Use stolen identities to cover their tracks

In fact, they target millions of people to con them all - it's not just the elderly and the vulnerable.

War Memorial & Foot Bridge Repairs

The Parish Council are pleased to inform villagers that the War Memorial by the Damerham Village Hall has been completely re-furbished in recognition of the 100th anniversary of the start of the First World War in 1914.
