



Damerham Parish Housing Needs Survey 2021

Damerham Parish Council and New Forest District Council have commissioned Hampshire Homes Hub to carry out an independent housing needs survey in the Parish. The purpose of the survey is to obtain information about the current and future need for affordable housing in Damerham. Providing a small number of affordable homes for local people can allow current and future generations to remain in or return to their community.

If you have a local connection to the Parish and are in need of affordable housing, please complete and return this survey. If a close family member has left the Parish and is in need of an affordable home in Damerham, please ask them to complete this survey, or complete the survey on their behalf. As part of the survey we would also like to hear from households where there are children currently under the age of 18 who may need their own affordable home in the Parish in the next few years. **The Housing Needs Survey will be delivered to all households in the Parish with the January Pump.**

The information that you provide will remain confidential. The information obtained will only be used to produce a report summarising the housing need in the Parish. The data obtained will be anonymised and will only be shown in summary or generalised statistical form.

At this stage, no decisions have been made about taking a scheme forward. This will depend on the survey outcome and will be subject to further discussion with the community.

FRAUD ALERT

Hampshire Constabulary is warning local residents across the whole of Hampshire to remain vigilant after an increase in incidents of courier fraud since the end of October and throughout November.



The crimes commonly involve an unexpected call from someone who purports to be a police officer or a staff member from their local bank, or an employee from an internet / phone provider.

They then tell the victim that their account has been subject to fraudulent activity, or is in danger of being closed and then request the victim assist them with the ongoing investigation, with this involving:

- being asked for detail about their financial accounts and bank cards,
- being sent to their bank to withdraw money, or being asked to buy high value goods, or
- grant the caller access to their computer or phone, by downloading an application.

In recent cases we have seen a 'courier' being sent to victims' home address in order to collect the goods, cash or bank cards; but in some previous offences, victims have also been directed to send the items or money to a nominated address.

If you have been a victim of fraud, please report it by calling 101. You can make yourself aware of this type of scam and how to protect yourself by visiting the Action Fraud website (<https://www.actionfraud.police.uk/>) or by calling them on 0300 123 2040.

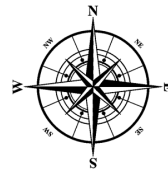
