## Nature Notes from Paul T

Weather in April. Another fairly wet month with 68mm of rain, compared with the average of 52mm. There were 12 dry days, which was good for the gardening. The river Allen in Damerham is still flowing well. The warmest day was the 17<sup>th</sup>, when it reached 17C and the coldest was just 1C on the nights of 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. There were just 3 frosts.

April Wildlife. Alec saw a Pipistrelle bat flying at midday on 2<sup>nd</sup>. No doubt it was needing to restock food supply after a winter in hibernation. On the 30<sup>th</sup> there were several Pasque Flowers in bloom on Martin Down, and the Cowslips were magnificent.

With the butterfly season getting underway I thought it interesting to contrast the life cycles of the early species to be seen in the garden.

First out in the year is Brimstone, which can be seen on any warm day from February on. The adults spend the winter in hibernation, as do Peacock and Small Tortoiseshell which can also be seen on any warm day.

Brimstones have an extraordinary long life as adults; almost 12 months. The ones on the wing now will lay eggs on either Buckthorn or Alder Buckthorn and as neither of these is often very common, it is amazing how widespread and abundant this species is. The eggs hatch very quickly, and the larvae then feed on the leaves of the host plant for a few weeks and then pupate for just 2 weeks before the adults emerge to spend the rest of the summer, feeding on nectar ready for the long winter of hibernation. The next species to emerge in April and early May is the Orange Tip. These have spent 8 or 9 months as a chrysalis. The males are the ones

with the orange tips to their wings whereas the females look very like the other whites from above. Both of them, however, are very different from the other whites underneath, as the underside of their hind wings are mottled green and white. The females lay eggs on a few different Crucifers, but in the garden, the wind flower Garlic Mustard is the most usual, although Honesty is also frequently chosen. In meadows and by the ponds, Cuckoo Flower is the usual host. It is quite easy to find the eggs on the underside of

the leaves, but the caterpillars are a bit more tricky, as they resemble the seed pods of the plants on which they feed. After only a few weeks, the caterpillars pupate, and the chrysalis has a long 9 months to survive to the following spring.

Another early butterfly is the Holly Blue. These are interesting because they have 2 generations each year, which feed predominantly on different plants. The ones which emerge now lay eggs on a variety of shrubs, but most commonly on Holly. The eggs hatch quickly, and the caterpillars feed for a few weeks before pupating. A new generation of adults then emerges in July and August, and this time, most eggs are laid on lvy. The winter is spent as a chrysalis.
