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Nature Notes From Paul T.

Weather in June

We had 25mm of rain compared with the average of 85mm and there were 23 days with no rain. The warmest day was 13th when it reached 30C and the coolest night was on 4/5th at 10C Average high was 25C and average low 13C.

Wildlife

We have had several Grass Snakes on our allotment with as many as 4 on a few occasions. Slow-worms and Common Lizards in the field and a lot of damselflies on the garden pond. We have seen 2 Goshawks in Damerham and just one sighting of a Hobby. There were not many butterflies around until the end of the month and at that time a sudden appearance of grasshopper nymphs in our field.

Swifts

Last week there was a debate in parliament calling for the mandatory provision of "swift bricks" in new developments and I also read about a new book about swifts, "One Midsummer's Day" by Mark Cocker. For the past few years I have been a member of Hampshire Swifts, a group with the aim of improving the environment for these wonderful birds which have declined by 60% in Britain in the past 30 years. Swifts are the most completely airborne of birds spending their entire lives outside the breeding season on the wing. As they do not usually breed until they are at least 3 years old, just imagine how many wing beats without rest they must make. They even mate on the wing. The sight of packs of swifts screaming around towns and villages, often low to the ground is one of the most exciting experiences I know. Sadly, it is becoming seen less often as there has been a decline of about 60% in the British population in the past 30 years with an even bigger decline in southern England. Most adults return to Britain in early May or even later and then most leave again in early August in which time they nest, usually in cavities in buildings, lay 2 or 3 eggs and then rear their young. As they are dependent on flying insects, they are greatly affected by the weather and it is possible for birds nesting in southern England to collect insects as far away as Germany to bring back to the nest. The nestlings have evolved the ability to become torpid when food is scarce in bad weather and can go for several days without food, even as long as 3 weeks in the case of large young during which time they can lose up to 2/3 of their weight. The main reasons for their decline are considered to be loss of nest sites with modern buildings and the improvements in older ones providing none of the cavities which they need and to the reduction in insects due to the use of pesticides. How many moths come in through your windows now compared with 30 years ago?

So how can you help them? The provision of nest sites is something that many can do and this is especially important in areas where the birds are still breeding. There are a very few local authorities where provision of swift bricks is mandatory in new developments So encourage your local council to ask for these in any new building where they would be appropriate. Put up special nest boxes under the eaves of your house. Do not use any pesticides in your garden, they are really not essential. Finally, join Hampshire Swifts. **Happy spotting!!**

Avon valley shed (Men's Shed)

It's not all about making bird boxes.... But we can! It's about people (usually men) getting together in a shed environment over a cuppa and talking anything instead of being alone in a shed.

We do tasks for the community and social engagements mainly for our own piece of mind and satisfaction. (but a donation to funds for our costs is greatly appreciated) it is our ongoing intention to expand slowly, with having little groups of people engaging in such things like guitar sessions, with forthcoming ideas like photography, model making and more and all of which takes place on our Wednesdays session at the Methodist church hall in West St, Church St Fordingbridge SP6 1BB.

On Fridays we meet at Damerham sports field pavilion 09:30 till 12:00 and arrange pick up of colleagues from the Methodist church for those who can't get to Damerham otherwise.
