A heart-felt thank you to all our committee, volunteers and sponsors, without everyone pulling together there wouldn't be a Fair. We really value your support, and we were really pleased that many new faces helped out, as well as our regulars.

What a fantastic day! It was good to see so many people having fun and enjoying themselves – we were also blessed with the weather, with two heavy showers passing quickly through! We were entertained by the Mighty Smith in the main arena, and our new items proved successful, including a free bus service from Fordingbridge, crepe stand and the new bbg.

The Fair was a great success financially as well, and we have once again raised over £10,000. Funds are already committed to the Village Hall and Sportsfield for use of their facilities, Cadets who provide the car parking, Inner Wheel who run the tea and cakes and Pilgrims who run the dog show. As promoted at the Fair, we have also already sponsored projects this year (cleaning of the war memorial, dog poo bin, drinks hot water system) and our main project is sponsoring the School's new shaded play area (the Horticultural Society are helping in the design and the Avon Valley Shed will also assist).

The good news is that we have some left over funds to distribute to other village and local organisations or specific projects which benefit the village. We are setting up a new process replacing the general handouts we have previously made. We have also appointed noncommittee independent members who will assist in the review process

Nature Notes From Paul T.

Weather in July

A very wet month with 106mm compared with the average and just 10 days with no rain. The warmest day was the 19th with 24C, and the coolest night was 10C on the 25/25th. The average high was 21C and the low was 14C.

Wildlife

We have still been seeing one Grass Snake on our allotment all through the month, as well as Slow Worms and Common Lizards in the field, and a lot of Damselflies on the garden pond. Only a few Dragonflies. The poor weather has curtailed wildlife watching, so I have very few records. I did take part in the Big Butterfly Count near the end of the month, and there there were a lot of whites, mostly Large White, but also a few Green Veined White and Small White. A few Peacocks and Red Admirals as well as some Meadow Browns and Gatekeepers. Small Tortoiseshell are still very scarce, in spite of feeding on Stinging Nettles which are certainly not uncommon.

Chalk Streams

Chalk streams like the River Allen in Damerham are very rare, with less than 300 globally, and most of them are in Hampshire. The water in them comes from rainwater which has fallen on the chalk downs and then percolated through the chalk rock to emerge in the valleys below. Because the water is almost all from underground, it stays cool, at about 10C throughout the year, and this maintains a high concentration of oxygen which enables the streams to support a lot of invertebrates, such as Mayflies, Stoneflies and Caddis flies. These in turn supply food for the fish. Especially well known are Brown Trout, Grayling and Salmon, although these have decreased dramatically in recent years, and there are also Millers' Thumbs, Minnows and many other species. Many years ago, I used to take a group of children from Damerham school into the meadows here each week and we always made notes on the river, including taking the temperature. I especially remember the Brook Lampreys in the spring (river not season) making their nests with the fine gravel, and finding a Water Scorpion when the river was very low. Kingfishers are frequently seen feeding on the small fish, and in the past, Water Voles were often seen. I discovered when looking up information about streams that there is a species of blind and colourless crustacean which lives in the water down in the aquifer unchanged for millions of years, unaffected by the Ice Ages. One of the unique features of these streams is the winterbournes where the upper reaches of the river dry up during the summer, as the water level in the chalk aquifer falls, and then fill again as the winter comes. Unfortunately, many of them now dry up further down and for longer because of abstraction by water companies to supply our water, and this, and the pollution they suffer from agriculture and also sewerage is severely damaging them. Hopefully, we will take action to prevent further deterioration of this wonderful resource. Happy spotting!!

<u>Hampshire and The Islands Historic Churches Trust</u> <u>Ride and Stride – 9th September</u>


