Nature Notes from Paul T

September weather... A month of contrasts with lots of dry days and two very wet ones with 26mm on the17th and a huge 42mm on the 20th. The total for the month was 92mm, compared with the 70mm average. The twelve month total is now 971mm. It was very warm, and in the first 2 weeks the temperature never fell below 18C, and daytime temperatures reached the high twenties several times. From mid-month things were a bit nearer normal and the night temperature fell into single figures twice. Average maximum was 22C, and minimum was 14C. There was a spectacular thunderstorm on the night of 18/19th, which lasted for over 2 hours.

<u>Wildlife</u>... I have very few records of wildlife for the month, as I was otherwise occupied, but one evening driving to Odstock a Merlin dashed over the hedge and flew along the road in front of me for about 400m and then as it turned aside, a Hen Harrier flew across behind it. Quite a surprise. Earlier that day, there was a huge flock of Swallows on the wires in Homington. We visited Langford Lakes one day, and had a meal in a cafe overlooking the lake, and a Kingfisher settled in a Willow in full view, about 8m above the water, before diving into the lake and emerging with a fish. On walking round we saw several Common Sandpipers, Snipe and Lapwing. It is well worth a visit.

I came across an article on Elder recently, and was surprised by some of the information. I expect that most people reading this know the Elder when it is in flower in the spring, and again in late summer with its crimson berries. I expect many have made or drunk the wine, champagne or cordial made from the flowers, and perhaps wine from the berries. This glut of berries is a very valuable source of energy for the birds to fatten up before winter, or for fuel on migration. Recent studies have shown potential for treatment of cancer. The central tissues of the stem of Elder is soft and pithy, but the rest of the wood is surprisingly hard and similar to Box. It was widely used in the past for carving to make bowls, cogs and tool handles and also for making musical pipes. The scientific name Sambucus, is derived from the Greek for pipe. The pith has been used for a long time for holding biological specimen sections for study under the microscope, and is still used by watchmakers to absorb excess oil.

Most Elders are not much more than shrubs, but if allowed full freedom they can become quite an impressive tree, and one in our wood is 10m high, and a wonderful sight in flower. Elder does not support many invertebrates, with just 30 insects recorded, compared with more than 240 on Oak, but some of them are solely dependent on this tree, and it does

support a wide range of lichens and liverworts because its bark has such good water retention. Happy spotting!!
