Nature Notes from Paul T

October Weather: Another very wet month, with 198mm rain, compared to the average of 86mm and 2 days with more than 20mm. There were 9 days with no rain. The 12 month total is now 975mm. October was mostly very warm, with 2 nights when the temperate only fell to 17C. There were no frosts and the coolest night was on 16th/17th at 5C.

Wildlife: I have not been out very much partly because it has been so wet. On 8th October, it was fine and warm, and we had lunch in

a friend's garden. In the next couple of hours there, we were treated to a fine display of birds. It started with 2 Ravens flying over, followed a few minutes later by a Sparrow Hawk. Next was a fine view of a Goshawk really low, a Buzzard soared high overhead,

and then last of all, a Kite. Quite a birding lunch! On 24th October, there was a Hummingbird Hawkmoth on the warm wall in Swanage. I saw a Barn Owl on the 26th – my first in a very long time. I know we have them in Damerham, and I am surprised at how rarely I see one. And Red Admiral and Peacock butterflies spotted in the garden.

There were still masses of flowers out, right to the end of the month, and I was still putting out cut flowers into November. I read an article recently about bird rings and raptors. It started in 1997 when a bird ringer found a ring at a Peregrine roost in the

Brecon Beacons (this is now called something else!). He found more rings there, one from a bird ringed in the Netherlands and one from Denmark. He then tried using a metal detector, and friends

joined in. Over a few years, they found British rings from Blackbird, Dunlin, Jay, Starling, Song Thrush, Greenfinch, Great Tit, Chaffinch, Dipper (6) Reed Bunting Blue Tit, Sand Martin, Stock

Dove and Whinchat. They also found rings from birds ringed abroad. Starlings from Denmark, Latvia, Lithuania, Russia, Estonia, France, Netherlands and Sweden. They also found German Blackbirds, Fieldfares from Norway and Finland a Black Headed Gull from Lithuania, Common Terns from Netherlands and West Africa, Chaffinch, Woodcock and Sand Martin from France.

Many rings were from before 1950 as after that they tailed off, coinciding with the drastic decline in birds of prey due to the use of DDT. They increased again after the mid '70s. Over the years, many rings have also been found at archaeological sites, with 67 species recorded.

I ringed birds for several years back in the 60s and 70s, and in that time we had a few recoveries. A Fieldfare ringed in Wilts and recovered in Russia, and a Redwing recovered in Italy later in the same winter in which we had caught it. My only really interesting one was a Whinchat which I ringed as a nestling in mid-Wales which was trapped in the breeding season on Salisbury Plain where I lived at the time.

Damerham Parish Council

Your Parish Council is anxious to keep any increase in Council Tax next year to a minimum. However, we are facing significant cost increases for the year ahead. One such example is the new policy from NFDC to charge the Parish Council for the regular emptying of the litter and dog waste bins in the village from April 2024. This charge will be at least £1250 a year, which is a major increase in the Parish Council expenditure.

A suggestion for helping to offset this charge is to find local sponsors for the litter/dog waste bins. If there are any local businesses or individuals who would be willing to sponsor a bin or bins, please contact our Parish Clerk at

The Parish Council is also faced with significant costs in replacing play equipment on West Park Meadow. In particular, the large basket swing, which has been very popular with generations of Damerham children over the years, has reached the end of its life, and has been removed from the Meadow for safety reasons.

The Council has had a very generous offer of a donation towards the cost of a new swing. Any further offers to help would be very welcome Please contact the Parish Clerk if you feel able to help. Thank you.
