Nature Notes from Paul T

Weather in March. Yet another very wet month, with 145mm of rain, compared with the average of 73mm. There were just 6 dry days and only 3 mornings when the sun shone! Only 3 frosts. The rainfall for the past 12 months is 1233mm compared with the long term average of 943mm. However, it does mean that the river is really lovely, and the Swans have been about in the upper reaches and perhaps will nest again this year. By the first 5 days of April, we had already had half the average monthly rain.

Wildlife. The Cherry Plum was in flower on 12 February this year, 2 weeks later than in 2023, and Blackthorn, which is usually a fortnight later, was not really out until the end of March. This is surprising, as it has not been cold, so what delayed it this year? On 21 March, a warm day brought many Hoverflies out, and by the end of the month, there were lots of Blackcaps and Chiffchaffs singing. I have seen several Kestrels, so hope that they are recovering from a slump, but I do wonder if the wet winter might have adversely affected the vole population.

No Mow May. Most of you will have heard about this, and have perhaps thought about doing it. I don't think that the title gets it quite right. I won't be completely abandoning the mower as I still keep the paths and the lawn where we sit cut this month, but I would encourage people to leave as much as possible uncut for at least a month. Then, see what plants are there, released from the mower and able to flower. When I worked for the MOD I persuaded one of the RAF experimental sites to delay the first mowing of a small landing strip which had been kept really short for many years. The result was an amazing display of hundreds of Green Veined Orchids which had been waiting for the chance to flower. Try it and see what you have. Then you might be persuaded to improve the area by adding plants which can thrive in longer grass, such as Birds Foot Trefoil, Devils-bit Scabious, Moon Daisy, Knapweed, Cowslips, Betony and many more. This will in turn, provide food for insects such as butterflies, and habitat for Slow Worms and young frogs. I grown many of these plants and each year add a few to my 'meadow patch' and can usual provide some for the cost of a donation to Marie Curie. If you can leave long grass until late summer before cutting, it will further enhance the wildlife interest enabling grass feeding butterflies such as Meadow Brown and perhaps even Marbled White to breed. If you can get Yellow Rattle to grown, this will keep the grass in check and encourage more flowering plants. Orange-tip Butterflies, which are on the wing from early April, lay their eggs on various Crucifers, particularly Cuckoo Flower, Garlic Mustard and Honesty, so if you have any of these, be sure not to cut them down until the caterpillars have fed and pupated.
