Nature Notes from Paul T.

Weather for August: Very dry until the last few days. There were 23 dry days and then in the last week 27mm fell so the total was 40mm, only 12mm below the average. The 12 month total is now 815mm. Another warm month with an average high of 25C and coolest night 7C on 21/22nd. Warmest day was 14th at 32C. Lowest maximum was 21C and highest minimum 17C on 2 nights. Average high was 25C and average

minimum 12C. Wildlife: In late August I went to Cardigan for a few days to join my daughter and family in a house on the estuary just west of Cardigan town. I drove there, leaving Damerham at dawn and by the time I reached Broadchalke over the downs as dawn broke I was pleasantly surprised by all the wildlife. A roe deer leapt out of a hedge only inches in front of the car nearly ending my journey then and there and another trotted down the road for a while. A Buzzard was already out hunting and 2 Red Kites swept overhead. I saw my first Rabbit in many months and there were dozens of Wood Pigeons on the road. Then I saw nothing else on the rest of the journey of nearly 5 hours. Nor did I see a single bird of prey in the next 4days in Wales! Quite extraordinary. A boat trip in Cardigan Bay gave good views of a school of Bottle-nosed Dolphins and a few Grey Seals and pups. From the house as the tide ebbed and the mud was exposed we saw Little Egret, Heron, Cormorant, Redshank, Ringed Plover, and Oyster-catcher. Also Kingfisher, Grey and Pied Wagtails, lots of gulls plus all the more usual garden birds. I ran my moth trap in the garden hoping for some different species from my usual catch here but only caught the same ones as home. Back home we had an Old Lady Moth a very large and beautiful species which I rarely see. I was still catching Jersey Tiger moths at the end of September. Although the water in our new pond has been very low it has still been interesting with regular visits from Emperor and Broad -bodied Chaser dragonflies and I was surprised to find a large (but dead) nymph of the latter in such a new pond. There are lots of water boatmen and 3 small frogs were seen recently. On the last days of August we had dozens of House Martins over the garden and now by the time I write they have nearly all gone it seems. I did see a lone Swallow on 10th Sept and no doubt there will still be some around for the next couple of weeks before all have gone to warmer places for the winter ahead. Tawny Owls are beginning to set up territory now with marvellous calling in the woods around us at

dusk and it is worth going out to listen just after dark in the next few weeks. Alec and I were very disappointed that we missed the recent

eclipse of the moon as we did not know about it. Another two years to

wait for the next one I believe.

Bridleway Improvements

A couple of years ago, Annie Bellows was able to get a couple of the farmers alongside bridleway 46 between Damerham and Sandleheath to improve the surface and put in some drainage. She also had the Countryside Department out and they discussed further improvements. This year, they have been successful in obtaining a considerable grant to improve the bridleway, and will start work in October. It will take between 4 and 6 weeks to complete.

Local Government Reorganisation

Hampshire County Council has decided on its preferred option for how the new Unitary Authorities will be organised, which would see us joining with Southampton, plus Test Valley and Eastleigh.

The rest of Hampshire councils (including NFDC) have also now published results of their research, but no agreement has been reached on which of their 3 options is the best. That means it is most likely that 4 different plans will be submitted to the Government on 26th September, and it will be left to the Government to make a final decision. There will be a consultation taking views from the public on which option should be chosen, starting in November, with the final decision due by March next year.

Wheelie bins! The rollout in our area starts on 20th October. The changes being introduced are greater than many people realise, and although the phase 1 rollout has been mostly very successful, a few people have had some quite severe disruption to their rubbish collections. Therefore, we would urge you to check everything is as it should be in good time before the rollout, so that queries and problems can be ironed out in advance. The customer service team are still quite stretched, so there may be a delay in getting a response. In particular: If you think you have been missed off the wheelie bin deliveries ie if all your neighbours have them and you don't, then contact the Council without delay - don't wait until the new collection starts. Some businesses such as village halls and holiday lets may have had their waste collected along with the household waste collections (although that wasn't actually legal). Businesses will not be getting wheelie bins and will be expected to use the business waste collection in future. Do check if you think this applies to you, as you will need to register for business waste collections. You can check here www.newforest.gov.uk/findmyphase if your property will be receiving domestic waste collection.
