Paul T's Nature Notes

Weather for December 2025.

A very wet month with 198mm compared with the average of 95mm. The total for 2025 was 823mm still well below the long-term average of 943mm. On 17th we had 38.8mm. There were 7 frosts and the highest temperature was 14C on 4 consecutive days in the second week. The coldest night was on 30th at minus 2C. The average maximum was 10C, minimum 4C.

Wildlife

A rather quiet month because of the wet which restricted outdoor activity but there were some good highlights. On Christmas Eve we stopped at Blashford Lakes and had our picnic in the Tern Hide because of the weather. A large group of gulls was resting at the far side of the lake and they suddenly all rose high over the water. I suspected a raptor and we searched among the whirling gulls and spotted a White-tailed Eagle, which flew across in front of the hide and landed not far away. A few moments later it got up and then flew at very high speed low down above the water giving us great views. I think that even my teenage granddaughters were impressed. This was only the second eagle I have seen in the UK (the first was also this species) as even though I have had many holidays in Scotland I have never seen an eagle there.

The meadows in Damerham have been flooded for some weeks and are always worth looking at. A pair of Mute Swans has been there for a while and there are usually Pied Wagtails flitting about. Grey Wagtails used to be seen frequently and bred for years but seem to have left the village in recent years. I did however see one in the yard of the Ship Inn in Fordingbridge recently which was a surprise. There have been Snipe, Little Egrets, Herons and Mallard on the floods as well and a flock of Starlings (called a murmuration) has been roosting in the reeds. As dusk approaches many hundreds of birds join together from their daytime feeding areas and zoom over the meadow for several minutes before suddenly diving into the reeds for the night. Flocks of gulls have been gathering on the flood water in the afternoon before flying off to roost probably at Blashford. There have been Common Gulls, Black-headed Gulls and Lesser Black-backs.

One of my Christmas presents was a very interesting book about Buzzards (by Robin Prytherch) which is based on the superb sketches he made of all the Buzzards in his study area of North Somerset. The area was just 75 square kilometres and when he started in 1982 it had 13 territories. In 2020 there were 120 territories, an amazing density. He sketched every bird and could recognise them all individually and the book is based on Christmas cards he did each year with details about the bird or birds and their life histories. Now the weather has got colder there has been more movement of winter visitors with Flocks of Fieldfare and Redwing and we have seen Lapwings flying over to the south. Don't forget that I would like to hear about any of your sightings.

Bridleway News from Annie Bellows.

I wanted to provide an update on the bridleway improvement works. The resurfacing and drainage on 'Muddy Lane', from the Sandleheath end, have now been completed. The remaining actions relate to the fencing and gate requested by Mr and Mrs Gould; the sleeper posts have been reinstated, and I am awaiting their response following further consultation. I will also seek to replant some of the lost hedge in early February. The central section has also been resurfaced, and substantial drainage improvements have been installed. Although not all of this is visible, it will significantly improve the long-term condition of the bridleway and support any agricultural machinery that uses it.

Outstanding items:

- We are still awaiting approval of the Ordinary Watercourse Consent for the installation of the culverts and stone topping, which will remove the need for the unsuitable single-plank bridges. Subject to weather, I hope the contractors will complete this by the end of March.
- Additional funding has been secured to address the persistent water pooling at the Damerham end. Following a site meeting with the contractor yesterday, temporary drainage works will begin next week, with a permanent solution to be installed alongside the culvert works. This should provide a fully usable, year-round bridleway by the end of April.

Roadworks

There are lots of roadworks going on and scheduled locally in the next few months – I am sure you have discovered all sorts of interesting detours already. The date for Court Hill closure seems to keep moving, so keep an eye on the Western Downland Noticeboard facebook page for real time updates. All the disruption will be worth it in the end!
